PLANNING & PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT INFORMATION

Both the threat and the reality of large scale developments within the village and surrounding areas is never far away. The Parish Council are informed and have the chance to comment on every planning application within Rolleston, or effects Rolleston.

COLLEGE APPEAL

Solicitors for Burton and South Derbyshire College have, as suspected, applied to go to Judicial Review over the Secretary of State decision to refuse planning permission on the College Fields. There is as yet no timescale for this to be heard. We will of course keep you informed of any developments.

GLENVILLE FARM

Outline Planning Permission has been submitted for a large development on the Glenville Farm site. Whilst the majority of the plan falls outside the Rolleston Boundary it would have an impact on the village. The Parish Council have objected to the plan.

NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN

The Neighbourhood development Plan has not been put to referendum by East Staffordshire Borough council. There are items within the plan which have been reviewed. The six weeks consultation period could not start until after the General election due to the period of time known as Purdah.

BROOK HOLLOWS

Members of the Parish Council continue to talk with experts and representatives from East Staffordshire Borough Council to discuss the future of Brook Hollows.

The Parish Council hopes you will have noticed the improvements to Brook Hollows which have already been made. Funding is being sought from the Neighbourhood Development Fund and Parks for People (Lottery fund). Information is also being sought from English Heritage.

Whilst some of the work may seem drastic, the Parish Council seeks professional advice before any work is completed and carefully considers the impact to the village. Generally, trees are worked on due to health and safety implications to the general public, as well as the health and longevity of individual trees and those around them.
